

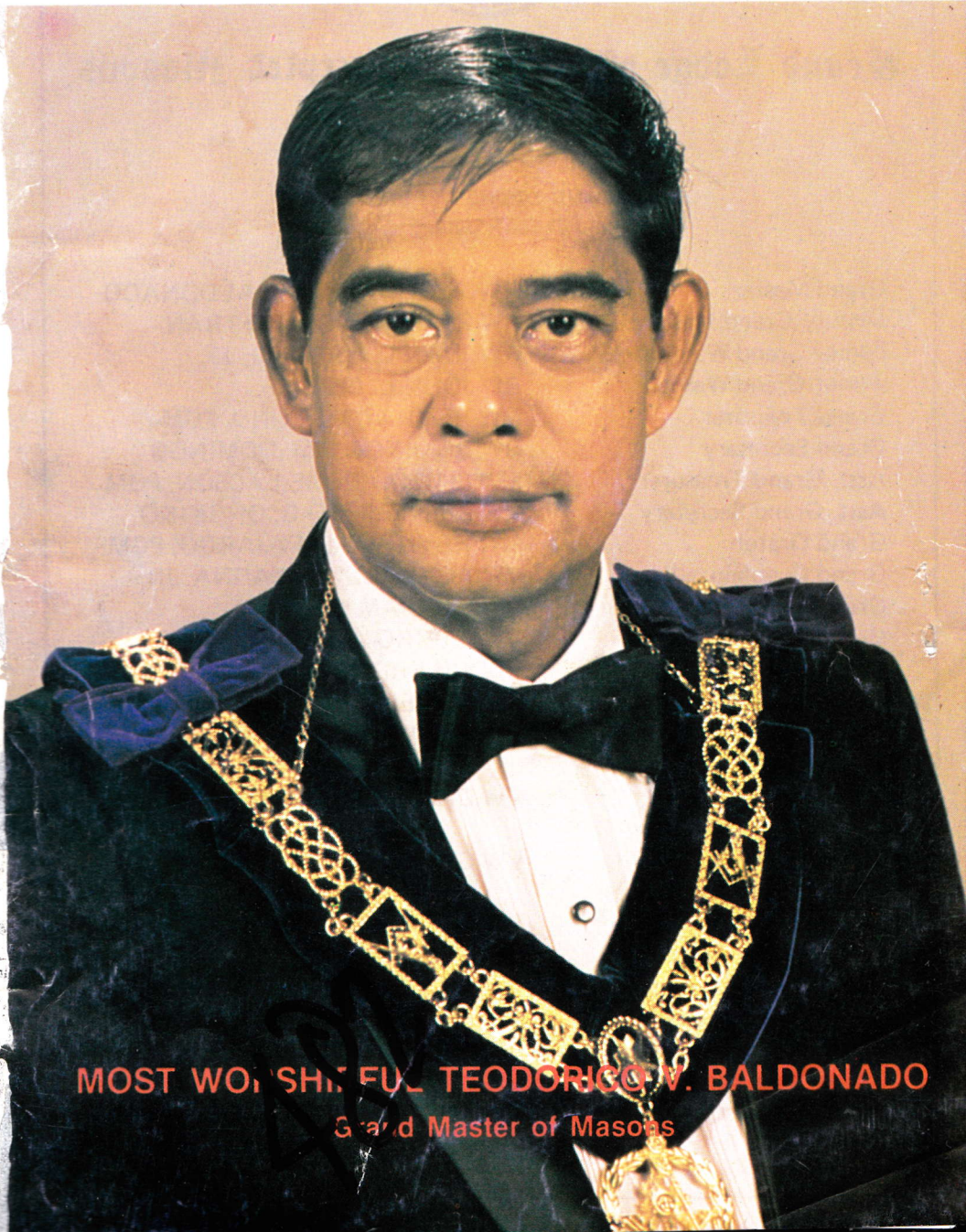

## GRAND ORATION

# MASONRY DOES NOT FAIL MAN, IT IS MEN WHO FAIL MASONRY

This year we are celebrating the 75th year of masonry in the Philippines. Our Grand Lodge officers, especially our incoming Grandmaster, RT.W. Teodorico Baldonado, are leaving no stone untouched to assure the success of the celebration. On the trestle board is a carefully crafted year long celebration with which we shall regale the world and ourselves of the coming of masonry in this Pearl of the Orient Seas.

By any reckoning, 75 years constitute a considerable length of time. Masonry is freighted with immutable moral lessons and one of them relates to the significance of time. I hope you can remember the day when you knocked at the door of masonry and were initiated an Entered Apprentice. Bathed in the light of masonry, you were presented by the Worshipful Master the working tools of an Entered Apprentice. It is not without signi-

ficance that the first tool presented to you was the 24-inch gauge. And then came his explanation mossed with the wisdom of the ages: "The 24 inch gauge is an instrument made use of by operative masons to measure and lay out their works. But we as Free and Accepted Masons are taught to make use of it for the more noble and glorious purpose of dividing our time. It being divided into 24 equal parts is emblematic of the 24 hours of the day, which we are taught to divide into three parts, whereby we find a part for the service of God and a distressed worthy brother, a part for our usual vocations and a part for refreshment and repose." Our first working tool teaches us both the meaning and meaninglessness of time. It is meaningful when spent with sapience, meaningless when spent with senselessness. We are, therefore, to watch time with an eagle eye for in the prose of

Shakespeare, we may not hear the inaudible and noiseless foot of time as it passes by.

Our obligation to time compels us to re-examine the role of masonry as it enters its 75th year in our shore. Like any inspiring institution, Philippine masonry has its friends as well as its foes. Its foes assail masonry with a favor that transcends the borderland of fanaticism. They deny its goodness, just as they downgrade the goodwill of its votaries. Indeed they would begrudge masonry of any contribution in the making of our nation. These caustic critics conveniently forget that history is the torch of truth even as they history to prevent virtuous action from being forgotten. . . " A page of history is worth more than a volume of hysterics and our history bears the indelible truth that if the bells of freedom started to ring in this country it is because of masons who defied all the sticks and stones of persecutions. MW Teodoro Kalaw has preserved for posterity this historical reality. He wrote:

"Rizal, Del Pilar, Lopez Jaena, and others founded in Europe a Masonic organization in order to maintain unity among the Fili-

pinos and, thus united, call the attention of the world to the oppression of which their country was the victim, and demand urgent reforms. In order to maintain closer and secret relations with the patriots in the Philippines, the local Masonry was organized, subject to that of Madrid. The idea was that Freemasonry must be the *brain* to direct the Filipinos and *think for them*. There being no liberty to assemble and speak freely, the Lodges served as a place of assembly and a tribune. Soon they became the gathering places of the most progressive Filipinos who, being members of the heroic middle class, fostered the movement at the risk of their lives and property. Among those patriots, two are especially prominent who had nothing in common except their obscure descent. The first was a moral and intellectual leader of the first magnitude, a thoughtful and clam youth, a wise and deep thinker: Apolinario Mabini. The second was an ardent and bold youth of sound principles but radical procedure: Andres Bonifacio. They believed in the ideal which he pursued; but they could not approve his violent methods. Thus Bonifacio founded another specie of Freemasonry, with degrees, initiations, and pass-words, and in it he cultivated his desperation and radicalism. Thus *originated* the Kati-

punan which precipitated the country into the revolution. And as the government, confused it with real Freemasonry, many Masonic leaders died at the hands of firing squads or in exile without having seen the result of their labors.

But later, when the Filipinos, for a brief space, enjoyed self-government, whom did they place at the head of their civil and military government? The president of the republic was Emilio Aguinaldo, a member of Magdalo Lodge. The prime minister was Apolinario Mabini, orator of Balagtas Lodge. The secretaries of war were Balde-  
 mero Aguinaldo, of Pilar Lodge, and Ambrosio Flores of Bathala Lodge. The Secretary of Commerce and Industry was Gracio Gonzaga, of Minerva Lodge. The Director of War was Antonio Luna, of Solidaridad Lodge of Madrid. Among the most noted generals were Vicente Lukban, of Bicol Lodge, and Mariano Llanera, of the triangle Centeno. The president of the diplomatic committee abroad was Galicano Apacible, of Solidaridad Lodge, Madrid, and the following Masonic leaders of that period were diplomatic representatives in various parts of the world: Mariano Ponce, Rafael del Pan, Juan Luna, Ramon Abarda, Antonio Regidor, Sixto Lopez, Vergel de Dios, and Manuel Artigas. The grandest docu-

ment produced by the Philippine Revolution, according to the foremost American authority in the premises, James Leroy, was Mabini's Decalogue, a profoundly Masonic work. The most important and most discussed chapter of the Malolos Constitution, that on religious liberty, represented a victory of the Masons. And the triangle appearing on the Philippine flag, the loftiest symbolism of the struggles of the Filipino people, was put there according to President Aguinaldo, as a homage to Freemasonry. When a general of the American army wrote to a prominent Filipino, asking from where Mabini got his ideas, seeing that he had never been out of the Islands, the Filipino replied, in a document which is still preserved at Washington: "General, Mabini got them from Freemasonry, and nowhere else."

Unquestionably, therefore, the political convulsion in 1896 bears the Masonic signature. Last February 1986 the country again underwent a radical political upheaval. A twenty year regime was booted out of office thru a revolution, launched by love, powered by patience and upheld by prayer. While the principal dramatis personae of this revolution did not emerge from the quarries of the Craft, nonetheless it is fair to state that the stance of the greater number of the brethren was involve-

ment rather than indifferentism. Indeed, before opposition to the former regime became a fad and a fetish, the fraternity can boast of members who were among the first to mount resistance. And out in Edsa where human barricade stopped the roar of tanks and the bursts of cannon balls, the altar of sacrifice was not lacking in the body and spirit of masons. The role of our brethren in Edsa may not be heralded by the pomp of propaganda but it is nonetheless etched and treasured in the heart of every Filipino. This heroism should not and cannot be blotted out either thru organized occlusion or obscurantism. Otherwise, it will be extremely difficult not to yield to Napoleon's derision of history as nothing but a fable agreed upon.

But while masons won the 1896 revolution, while masons also fought in the February 1986 Edsa revolution, still and all masonry has yet to win its final battle. Masonry is enmeshed in a crucial battle where there is no peace talk, where there is no ceasefire, where there is no end except the end of time. This is the battle that is waged in

the breast of every man, the battle in which masonry seeks the expulsion of evil from the minds of man and the enthronement of righteousness in his heart. This is the battle that masons fight with the square of morality, the level of equality and with the plumb of rectitude. Albert Pyke tells us that the fight to cleanse the heart of man of the sediments of selfishness has been lost even by the most famous of men. I quote his catalogue of victims:

"This is that battle of life which is waged in the breast of every individual. Than this, no more important battle is ever fought. Alexander conquered the world and wept because there were no more worlds to conquer. This animal nature conquered Alexander and caused him to die in a drunken revelry in the streets of Babylon. Caesar, fired by love of country, led the Roman legions through a thousand battles to a thousand victories; love of material self induced him to commit the fatal act of placing on his own brow and crown of the Roman government and thus caused his sudden downfall. Napoleon unthroned kings and emperors of Europe and made them captives at his will. His selfish nature held Napoleon captive at its will, swept him behind his appointed bounds and thus caused

him to be banished to a lonely island.

x x x

Men everywhere overcome the obstacles to what they consider success, then yielding to the demands of their lower nature utterly fail to fulfill any useful mission in life and die unwept, unhonored, unsung.

I like to underscore the importance of this war waged in the breast of man in scarlet red because until it is won, masons have to continue fighting battles after battles, battles that will go beyond our diamond jubilee year, nay beyond our respective lifetimes. It is not without reason that our catechism teaches us that we were first prepared to be masons in our hearts. It is also not without reason that our heart was the one violently attacked by Jubelo to wrench away its fidelity to our timeless tenets.

The heart is the uncontroverted seat of our emotions. Jesus Christ Himself called for its purification and in His Sermon on the Mount. He blessed the pure in heart. Masons cannot miss the importance of an immaculate heart. Our principal tenets of brotherly love, relief and truth cannot emanate from a heart that has not been dredged of its dregs and dross. And our country today needs brotherly love, relief and truth if it hopes to be a haven to our people.

A serious syncretic study of our major problems show that they are polarization of the people, poverty and our distortions of truth. These are serious problems, ticking away alike bombs and which could well blow the country to smithereens unless smothered. Take for instance the splits and the schisms in our society. Their clear etiology is politics and appetite for power. For so long a time we have been poisoned by the pollution of politics, the kind of politics where according to Disraeli, nothing is contemptible. It is the kind of politics that is self seeking, with all its vice and viciousness of division. How different is it from the masonic ideal of politics, the politics of who best can serve and best agree. Who best can serve and best agree defines the parameters of our politics. Its essence represents the distillation of the wisdom of the greatest of religions and of religious teachers. Who best can serve and best agree is a refrain of the counsel of Confucius for us not to be concerned because we are not in office but in making ourselves qualified for office; not to be concerned that we are unknown but with being worthy of reputation. It is a piece of Taoism which teaches us that he who conquers others is strong but he who conquers himself is mightier. And of course, it is grooved to Christ's exhortation: If any man desire to be first, he should be last of all and servant of all. The Bible commentator Barclay says that this

doctrine made Jesus the greatest revolutionist of all time. I quote him:

**This doctrine reveals Jesus as the greatest revolutionist. For here is one of the great overturnings in all history. If any one would be first he must be last of all and servant of all. This is the world turned upside down. All our common measurements of importance and greatness are pronounced obsolete. The boast of heralphy and the pomp of power are irrelevant x x x He halted the whole human parade and puts it into reverse — the servant at the head and all the pompous kings who even reigned at the rear.**

It cannot be gainsaid that if the dew of harmony continues to cement us as brotherhood of men, it is because of our adherence to the politics of who best can serve and best agree. Masons should propagate this politics for it can cement all fizzes in our body politic. Needless to state, now more than ever let us not prostitute our masonic politics of who best can serve and best agree. It is an expression of brotherly love, and

brotherly love is a cornerstone of our Craft which we cannot afford to erode without endangering our whole edifice.

Or take the problem of poverty that besets the country. The number of Filipinos who fall and crawl below the poverty line continues to increase and at a bewildering velocity. The problem of poverty has a multiplier effect. It constitutes the cause of illiteracy of many of our citizenry. And thus know nothing citizenry has been and will always be our weight of woe. They are most vulnerable to the deception of forces that worship the cult of godlessness and preach violence to achieve change in our society. Poverty also mothers corruption both in our public and private sectors. Corruption continues to seduce some of our people because of the pull of poverty. What hurts is that poverty reigns in our country, although we live in a land of abundance and we are surrounded by a sea of sufficiency. Quite clearly poverty then hounds our people because of the greed of many and the generosity of but a few. How true is the observation that the lust of avarice has so totally seized upon mankind that their wealth seems rather to possess them than they possess their wealth. This lust of avarice cannot seek shelter in the heart of a true mason. The masonic tenet of charity and relief is the antithesis of avarice. A masonic scholar explains our duty of charity in the following wise:

It is the Mason's part to protect the disadvantage against rapacity and craft; to succor and comfort the poor and be the guardian, under God of His innocent and helpless wards; to value friends more than riches and gratitude more than money; xxx to be liberal but only that which is his own; to be generous but only when he has been just; to give not only until it hurts but until it satisfies.

It is therefore clear that if this country intends to wipe out poverty it might as well inculcate in its people the masonic tenet of charity and relief.

I can go on and on reciting the country's problems and how they can be repudiated by masonic tenets but I will not wear your patience thin. And so let me just wind up by emphasizing that as we celebrate our 75th year, let us hold fast to our masonic con-

victions. They are timely and timeless. The Jubelos, the Jubelas and the Jubelums will always taunt, harass and persecute our rank. A true mason will often times be misunderstood, sometimes be threatened physically and spiritually and a few times be persecuted to death for his beliefs. But a true mason should not barter away his conscientious convictions. His convictions should not be changed by the corruptions of comfort. Neither should his convictions be dictated by the demands of the majority or by the catcalls of the minority. A true mason clings to his conviction because in the best of his God given light, it is the truth or the nearest approximation thereof. Let us then cling to our conviction and as we joyously celebrate our diamond anniversary, let us always remember that masonry has never failed man, it is men who fail masonry.

INAUGURAL ADDRESS

# LET US KEEP FAITH WITH OUR MASONIC FOREBEARS

(Delivered by MW Teodorico V. Baldonado,  
70th Grand Master on his Installation on  
April 25, 1987 at Davao City)

Brethren of the Grand Lodge and  
My Friends:

Three years ago, you did me the great honor of elevating me to the high position of junior and grand warden. Under the circumstances of my election at that time, it was then impossible for me to have declined the honor without appearing to be ungrateful, if not a downright hypocrite. And so, as I accepted the position, little did I realize at that time, that in so doing, I had, even then, made a commitment to you, my Brethren, to accept the highest office in the Grand Lodge, that was within your power to bestow. Your having successively elected me in the next two years to the positions of Senior Grand Warden, and Deputy Grand Master, and my unhesitating acceptance of those offices, had merely made much more firm,

that previous commitment. When, by you will and pleasure, and by the grace of TGAOTU, you elected me yesterday, as your next Grand Master, the only honorable course of action for me, was to accept your mandate, to which I had impliedly committed myself three years before. For indeed, as I have often said, and have come to realize, when you elect Junior Grand Warden, you are, in effect electing a future grand master.

This afternoon, you have installed me as your Grand Master, the 70th in a long line of illustrious brethren who had occupied the grand oriental chair. For me, this event has to be one of the most significant and happiest milestones in my life, both as a man and as a mason. I am not unmindful of the trust and confidence that you have manifested in me, by

bestowing upon me, this great honor, nay, this great privilege, of serving you and the craft in that capacity, and for this, I am deeply grateful to you all.

But in a larger sense, this occasion is, for me, not only the culmination of that great journey to the grand east that began three years ago, but also my moment of truth, when everything that I say and do, or fail to say and fail to do, will come under your careful scrutiny and measured against the standards set by my illustrious predecessors, and judged as bad or good, failure or success. Now that I hold the reins of leadership of the craft in this part of the world, I begin to realize only too well, the tremendous responsibilities thrust upon me as your Grand Master. The great sense of inadequacy that I feel at this very moment, brings little comfort to the job ahead of us. I have often wondered, of late, if any of my predecessors had felt, or that anyone will ever feel, that he had thoroughly and adequately prepared for the exalted position of grand master of masons in this, or, in any other grand jurisdiction.

But I must say to you now, that with the aid and assistance of the supreme ruler of the universe and with your unselfish support, my brethren, I shall endeavor, with all the modest things that God has blessed me, and to the best of my ability, to be equal to the serious responsibilities of the office of Grand Master. I shall provide you

this year with the guidance and instructions that you, my brethren, have a right to expect from your grand master. Alone, there is little that I can accomplish; but together, we can accomplish much, much more than you and I, can imagine. Should I succeed in any undertaking, that success shall be as much your success, as it shall be mine. Should we fail, however, I promise you, that it shall not be, for want of effort and determination, nor, for lack of trying.

Seventy-five years ago, on December 19, 1912 to be exact, a handful of pioneering freemasons founded the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the Philippines. That they were Americans is not as important as the fact that they were masons, deeply committed to the stability and growth, not only of freemasonry in these tropical islands, but of the country as well. In the second annual communication of the fledgling grand lodge held on February 3 to 9, 1914, the grand orator, Bro. Charles C. Cohn, delivered a stirring oration which he entitled: *"Masonry's Part in the Philippine Temple"*. Bro. Cohn started his address by alluding to how it was decreed in the wisdom and counsels of deity aforetime, that a house should be built, erected to God and dedicated to his holy name, and how the pioneer masons at that time, were also engaged in building a Philippine temple, by which he meant, not a material, physical

temple, but the spiritual temple of masonry, amidst those conditions prevailing, during that period of socio-economic and political reconstruction of a territory just won, from Spain by the Americans Bro. Cohn said, in part, and I quote:

**"Houses built by the decree of God, and acceptably dedicated to his holy name, are not built for a year and a day. Untoward disasters may befall the master builders, and the work may be embarrassed temporarily by the unfamiliarity of those who are suddenly called to replace the masters. But not for that reason shall the work already accomplished be thrown away nor lost, nor yet shall the work cease nor fail of completion. Your only concern then will have to do with the permanence of your personal assignments in the task, which, like the stones hewn and squared by your ancient brother, will have a duration proportionate to the quality of the effort bestowed upon them.**

Bro. Cohn concluded his oration with these prophetic words and again I quote:

**"The scope of our activities lies far beyond our personal selves, and if we, but build in the temple, as honest and diligent workmen must do, our works will grow up around us in plain**

**and visible form. Future generations, not only of Filipinos, but of civilized mankind, will contemplate the works, being installed this day, in admiration and commendation . . . and when the Philippine temple shall have been completed, it shall shine forth not only to the glory of him to whom it is dedicated, but as a work to be imitated and rebuilt by masons as often and as universal as the temple of the wise King Solomon."**

My brethren, this year 1987 is a historic year for many reasons. For one, it is the year a new constitution of the Philippines was ratified in a plebiscite said to have been the most peaceful in a long long while. Of greater importance, masonically, this year marks the 75th anniversary — the diamond jubilee — of the founding of our grand lodge. This annual communication, our 71st, is also historic because not only does it fall during the diamond jubilee of our grand lodge but also, is the first to be held outside the city of Manila where all the previous 70 annual communications were held. It is also the first to be held in this great city of Davao, which is to say, that there could be a second, or even a third. Incidentally, while this year marks the 75th anniversary of the founding of our grand lodge, this year's annual communication is only our 71st. This discrepancy is due to the fact that during the years of 1942,

1943, 1944 and 1945 or a total of 4 years, our grand lodge was prevented from holding its annual communication by world war II.

It is one of those happy coincidences of history, that I happen to be grand master, during this historic year and this historic annual communication. Hopefully, posterity shall remember me, if for nothing else, as the first grand master to have been installed outside Metro-Manila, and the first to have been installed in the city of Davao.

In celebration of the diamond jubilee of our Grand Lodge, it is but fitting and proper, that we recall to mind and pay tribute once again, to those illustrious brethren whose collective labors and wisdom, during the 75 years of existence of our grand lodge have made her recognized as regular, by all regular grand lodges in the world, and acknowledged as one of the most active and progressive grand lodges on earth.

As inheritors of a glorious masonic past, we, the Philippine masons of today, have a sacred and solemn duty to preserve, the high standards set by our founding fathers and predecessors. Let us so live, that by our words, our thoughts and our actions, the prestige and high standing, presently enjoyed by our grand lodge, are maintained unsullied, and shall continue to be transmitted, from generation to generation. This we owe, to those who have gone before us, who so carefully and painstakingly nurtured and deve-

loped the good image of our grand lodge.

How well, my brethren, have we kept faith with our masonic forebears? How do Philippine masonry and Philippine masons today measure up to the prophetic vision of Bro. Cohn? In his words that I quoted earlier, is the Philippine temple of freemasonry today, worthy of admiration and commendation? The answers to these questions I shall leave to your individual hearts and consciences, to work out and resolve.

But as for me, I have found in my travels that there are sufficiently a great number of masons whose quiet lives and reputation in society and in the communities where they live, justify my belief in the aphorism: "a mason amongst men is a diamond amongst gems" this has, of course, been inspired partly by the fact that we mark the diamond jubilee of the grand lodge this year. But over and above this, you will no doubt agree with me, that among the great men of Philippine history that we revere today, the names of Jose Rizal, Del Pilar, Mabini, Bonifacio, Lopez Jaena, Kalaw, Quezon, Abad Santos, Tria, Herrera, Guerzon, Puno, Fajardo, shine brightly like diamonds amidst an array of equally valuable gems. By their sacrifice for country, their works, their writings — these men, these masons, have touched the lives of generations of Pilipinos both in the past as well as in the present and in the future and have

enhanced the good image that freemasonry, enjoys today in our country.

But is not given to every man to bear arms for his country's defense. Not every one is given the opportunity to pay the supreme sacrifice for country like a Rizal or an Abad Santos but certainly, every man here present, can so live their lives, in quietude service to his community and fellowmen, in devotion to God and family as true and genuine masons, that in a community of such good men, their exemplary lives shall stand out and shine forth as the diamond amongst a basketful of gems. And I know, that among those present here today, there are such men and masons whereof I speak.

(I need not go far for an example. In the city of Davao, I know of a man and a mason, a physician by profession, whose unselfish devotion and service to his patients, both masons and non-masons alike, have endeared him to his fellowmen. He is, I am sure, known to all of you as he has by his quiet and self-effacing leadership, provided the inspiration in bringing this annual communication to Davao. To me, he is no less a hero than his illustrious namesake.

Such, my brethren, is the force and influence, that masonry exerts in the lives of men and nations. I have the greatest faith that if all of us but adhere strictly to the tenets and teachings of our noble brotherhood, masonry can be an effective

and potent moral force that can be brought to bear on the current mis-understandings among some of our people, and cause true friendship to develop among those who might otherwise remain at a perpetual distance. Truly then shall "a mason amongst men be a diamond amongst gems."

It is because of this great faith I have in you, my brethren, that I do not hesitate at this time, to share with you my plans for the ensuing masonic year. We close this chapter of our history, and we open a new chapter, which is the next 25 years, that shall carry us beyond this century.

During my term, I shall address myself to the following areas of concern:

1. The completion of our grand lodge temple;
2. The holding of appropriate activities to celebrate the diamond jubilee of our grand lodge; and
3. Continued implementation of programs initiated by my predecessors in office.

*Completion of our grand lodge temple.* This shall be our first priority. Consider these facts; construction commenced with the laying of the cornerstone of the temple on July 25, 1979, by MW Jolly Bugarin who was then Grand Master. By March 1980, escavation was begun for the laying of the foundation of the temple. From the laying of the cornerstone up to this

very day, exactly 7 years and 9 months have elapsed and eight grand masters had occupied the grand oriental chair. It has taken longer, and more grand masters to build our grand lodge temple than it took King Solomon's temple to construct.

Today, I understand that our temple is only 60% finished and there is still substantial work to be done before it is completed. Many brethren have criticized the scandalously slow pace at which work on the temple is undertaken.

I believe that the time for empty words is past. The time for action is now. Mga Minamahal kong kapatid sa masoneria kailangang tayo ay magkaisa sa pagpapatuloy ng paggawa ng templo. Kung hindi tayo magkakasama-sama upang tapusin ang templo, sino and aasahan natin, in fact, it is long overdue, and if we but put our hearts, and minds, to this project, with everyone, really pitching in we can finish the temple in time to host a special annual communication on December this year, as a fitting climax to our diamond jubilee celebration. It is my intention, that at the appropriate time, I will approach each and everyone of you to assist in the completion of this project, a worthy project, which, in the words of Bro. Cohn "shall shine forth not only to the glory of him to whom it is dedicated, but as a work to be imitated," a monument to freemasonry that all masons, Filipinos and others can be justly proud of.

*The Diamond Jubilee.* Even as I speak, the appropriate plans for a sustained celebration of this event have been discussed and agreed earlier this morning with the grand lodge officers DDGMS and DGLS and copies of the program of activities distributed, I do not feel it necessary therefore to dwell at length on this subject. Suffice it to say that every district is urged to participate in these activities and every mason is earnestly enjoined to contribute his share for a meaningful celebration of his event. An event that comes to us only once in a lifetime. The jubilee festivities shall culminate, as I mentioned before, in a special annual communication of the grand lodge on December 19 of this year, at which occasion, we expect to have as our honored guests as many of the living past grand masters and the grand masters of grand jurisdictions in the Asia Pacific areas and, of course, the Grand Master of California.

*Masonic Education.* From observations made during my travels in this grand jurisdiction in the last few years, I have felt the need of the brethren for a more than cursory instruction on masonic philosophy and symbolism, along of course, with the ritual, floor work, lodge administration and allied subjects that make for a more efficient government of a lodge. Somehow, especially among our younger members, the rational explanation to be

found in our monitors no longer satisfy their great thirst for more masonic light. In this regard, I will request our senior grand lecturer and JGLS to conduct a seminar for DDGMS and DGLS on the subject of masonic philosophy and symbolism. To prepare a training module for this purpose, and to have this implemented within 3 months from now. I shall from time to time give you an up-date on this matter.

It is also my intention to revive the Philippine lodge of research. From consultations with some brethren it would seem that for this lodge to really function, we have to adopt a strict policy of limited membership.

What I have presented to you is just a bare outline of the program of work that I intend to pursue. There is still much to be done to flesh out these programs. But I foresee, my brethren, that I would have to cut down on my travel to the provinces, to enable me to attend more efficiently to the business of the Grand Lodge, to afford me time to think and contemplate, in order to live up to your expectation, of how your grand master should function. With these guidelines, I trust that we can forge ahead and we all can look forward to a fruitful masonic year. Thank you and mabuhay kayong lahat. .

# BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF MW TEODORICO V. BALDONADO

According to our 70th Grand Master, the very first time that he ever heard of Freemasonry was in the course of a lecture in an ROTC Camp in 1954 on the Philippine Revolution of 1896. From that lecture he learned, among other things, that men like Rizal, Mabini, Bonifacio, Del Pilar, Quezon and McArthur were Masons, that is, members of what many people believed was an anti-religion and atheistic fraternity that took part in blasphemous and even hedonistic ceremonies.

Unable to reconcile in his mind the noble works of the heroes of Philippine history with the alleged sinister and clandestine activities that he had heard so much about such a fraternity, his curiosity was all the more aroused and he decided then of his free will and accord to knock at the door of Freemasonry and thereby endeavor to know more about the organization.

The opportunity came years later when he discovered that one of his friends, RW DOMINGO F.M. DOMINGO, the then Assistant

Grand Secretary, was a Mason and to whom he inquired about the procedure of joining the fraternity.

RW Domingo F.M. Domingo originally wanted to sign him up with his mother lodge, T.M. Kaiaw Lodge No. 136, but recognizing the inherent leadership potential of the enthusiastic applicant, RW Domingo directed him to present his petition to the then fledgling Laong Laan Lodge No. 185 where it was felt his talent was needed. Thus it was, that it was in Laong Laan Lodge No. 185 that the future Grand Master was initiated on May 6, 1972, passed on June 3, and raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason on June 17 of the same year.

Laong Laan Lodge No. 185

immediately benefitted from the zealous and unselfish participation of MW Baldonado in its masonic activities as almost immediately after his raising, the new Master Mason was able to deliver for his lodge the required lectures of the three symbolic degrees, with such a high degree of proficiency that in the annual election of officers of the Lodge that same year, he was rewarded for his efforts with the almost unanimous choice for the position of Junior Warden, the lone dissenting vote having been his own.

Thereafter, MW Baldonado's journey to the East was inexorable until he was elected Worshipful Master of his lodge in 1975 during which period the lodge had 32 peti-

tioners, 25 of whom were personally raised by the future Grand Master. It was as Worshipful Master of his lodge that the leadership and administrative talents of the 70th Grand Master first manifested itself. Starting with only ₱600.00 in the lodge coffers at the beginning of his term, and faced with a financial obligation to the Grand Lodge of three times what the lodge had, he launched such a vigorous campaign for funds that when his term as Master was over, not only was the lodge able to pay its financial obligations to the Grand Lodge but that the Lodge had ₱11,000.00 more in its general fund, not counting the lodge paraphernalia and other lodge furniture and equipment procured during his term. Not unexpectedly, therefore, MW Baldonado was elected Treasurer of his lodge immediately after his Mastership, and held the same position until his elevation to the position of District Grand Lecturer of-Masonic District No. 9 in 1980.

MW Baldonado is credited with the revival of Juan Sumulong Lodge No. 169 which was set to surrender its Charter in 1977. Almost single-handedly, he set in motion a rescue operation that not only revitalized the lodge but also made its presently one of the most active and cohesive lodges in District No. 9.

The Masonic record of our 70th Grand Master shows the following:

member, Juan Sumulong Memorial Lodge 169; Honorary member, Manuel Quezon Lodge 262 and Lake Lanao Lodge 227; Member, Tandang Sora Court No. 8, Order of the Amaranth; Member, Filipinas York Rite Bodies; Organizer and Charter High Priest; Capitol Chapter //25; RAM Deputy Master, Capitol Council //13 Royal and Select Masters; Past Eminent Commander, Capitol Commandery #13, Order of Knights Templar, Conferred the Degree of High Priesthood; Past 1st V.P. Maginoo Shrine Oasis and Member of Islam Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S.

MW Baldonado is equally active in the Scottish Rite. He is the immediate Past Venerable Master of Balintawak Lodge of Perfection of Quezon City Bodies, and in recog-

nition of his various worthy accomplishments during his term as Venerable Master, he was awarded during the last Annual Session of the Supreme Council, the rank and decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honor (KCCH).

It was as District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 9 in 1982 that the leadership qualities of MW Baldonado came to the fore as he welded District No. 9 into one of the most cohesive and active masonic districts in the entire jurisdiction, functioning like a well-oiled machine. As a measure of the success with which MW Baldonado left his mark in District No. 9 as a legacy, his immediate predecessor as DDGM and he himself, were rewarded with election to the Grand South in immediate succession in 1983 and in 1984, respectively.

Our Grand Master was born on January 4, 1934, in Sta. Maria, Ilocos Sur. After his elementary education in his hometown, he went to the University of the Philippines where he finished his high school and B.S. Economics. He also took up the ROTC Advance

Course and as Cadet Lt. Col., he commanded one of the regiments. He was enrolled in the U.P. College of Law, pursuing a law degree, when he was called to active duty in the AFP as a Second Lieutenant. After his short stint in the Army he went to Graduate School of Business Administration major in Marketing.

He is now employed with RFM Corporation with the rank of V.P. and in-charge of Sales, Distribution, Marketing Services and Sales Administration. He attended various marketing and management seminars both here and abroad and he is a lecturer on sales management.

He is happily married to the former Teresa Ayson, a pharmacist and graduate of Sto. Tomas University.

MW Baldonado is also active in his other affiliations. He is the founding President of the District 9 Square and Compass Golf Club; Director, U.P. High Alumni Association; Director U.P. Vanguard Inc., Manila Chapter; Member, Fort Bonifacio Golf Club; Member, Camp Aguinaldo Golf Club and Member, Club Filipino.

**EXPLANATORY NOTES**

For a meaningful celebration this year of the 75th anniversary of the founding of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the Philippines (or its DIAMOND JUBILEE), we have planned different activities for each month from April to December.

For this purpose, we have formed the following committees that shall supervise and assist in the implementation of the program of Activities on the Grand jurisdictional level:

- II. *Finance Committee*  
Chairman — The Grand Treasurer
- III. *Ways & Means Committee*

V. *Publication Committee*

Chairman — MW Reynold S. Fajardo, PGM

Sub-committees were also formed to implement the planned activities for each month. In general, activities to be held in the National Capitol Region will be participated in by Grand Lodge Officers, while simultaneously, each District will hold similar activities on a District-wide level.

The following pages contain the general guidelines to be followed in the implementation of the planned monthly activities, with each District being given sufficient leeway & discretion to revise or amend specific activities within their own Districts to suit their respective resources and existing facilities. In

this manner, we hope to achieve a certain amount of flexibility while keeping to the substance, objectives and intention of these activities as planned.

We have also provided a slogan for each month that capsulizes the theme for the month.

All these activities shall culminate on the Anniversary Day itself, December 19, 1987, on which occasion a Special Communication of the Grand Lodge shall be convened. To ensure the success of our Main Celebration, we have formed a specific committee that shall prepare for this special day, and we have appointed MW Rosendo C. Herrera, PGM to chair this important committee. Under the able management by the MW Rody Herrera of this specific activity, there is no doubt that the grand celebration will be a resounding success.

### *I. FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL*

- A. Slogan — "SAPLINGS INTO TREES, MEN INTO MASONS"
- B. Designation — Tree Planting Month
- C. National Sub-Committee Chairman — MW Manuel D. Mandac, PGM (1980)  
Members — All DDGM's  
National Coordinator — VW Safiro Vinarao

### PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES

- 1. Objective — To plant 75,000

trees throughout the entire jurisdiction, or 1,000 trees for each year of existence of the MW Grand Lodge.

### *2. Method of Implementation*

- a. National Level — A tree plant ceremony to be participated in by Grand Lodge Officers shall be held during the 71st Annual Communication to kick-off the National Celebration of our Diamond Jubilee and the activities for this month.
  - b. District Level — Each District is given a quota of trees to plant during the period from April to December. With 220 lodges in the entire jurisdiction (excluding the 8 overseas lodges) each lodge shall have a quota of 341 trees to plant. The District quota is arrived at by multiplying the number of the lodges in each district by 341 trees. By December, we hope to be able to reach the national goal.
  - c. Target Areas for Tree Planting:
    - i. School Grounds — fruit bearing trees are suggested to be planted.
    - ii. Parks, Highways, Water Sheds — ornamental or timber trees are suggested.
3. Planning and Funding — Each DDGM shall arrange with the provincial or District Officer of the DNR for the procurement of

seedlings for free in support of this project, as well as coordinate with provincial or district Public Highways Officers on appropriate sites to plant trees in their respective districts or localities.

4. Reporting & Monitoring System — The National sub-committee shall, thru the National Coordinator, monitor the progress of this project. For this purpose, reports on the number of trees planted and specific sites shall be submitted by each DDGM to the Grand Lodge, attention of the National Coordinator, on June 30, Sept. 30 and Dec. 30, or as often as may be required or necessary.

## PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES

1. *Objective* — To have as many, if not all, lodges engage in as many sports tournaments or

competitions as possible within a district, or for each district to sponsor some sports competition for non-Masons, especially the youth.

## 2. Method of Implementation

- a. National Level — A National Championship Competition shall be held on December 18, 1987, in Manila to be participated in by as many District Champions as will qualify.
- b. District Level — Each district shall simultaneously conduct a tournament in as many sports as possible, to commence in May. If necessary, sports activities may extend to June but should be terminated not later than the end of July. District Champions should then be declared and their names submitted by the DDGM's to the Grand Lodge, attention of the National Coordinator.
- c. Suggested Sports —
- i. Chess
  - ii. Tennis (singles & doubles)
  - iii. Golf (national format to be announced)
  - iv. 5 km Fun Run
  - v. Ten-pin or duck pin bowling

3. Planning and Funding — Each DDGM shall plan on a District level the specific sports tournaments that they can hold, considering available resources and facilities. Expenses and prizes on

the district level shall be taken care of by each district and may be shared by the different lodges in the district. Trophies for National Champions will be awarded at the expense of the Grand Lodge.

4. Reporting and Monitoring System -- The National sub-committee shall monitor the progress and results of all sports tournaments, thru the National Coordinator. Each DDGM is expected to submit these results not later than the end of July, together with action photographs if possible, for future publication.

2. *Method of Implementation* --  
a. *National Level* -- Simultaneous display of Philippine Flag in residence of Masons and Masonic Temples on June 12, 1987.

Grand Lodge participation shall be arranged/coordinated on the following occasions:

i. On June 12 -- Independence Day Celebration at Kawit, Cavite with the DDGM of District No. 10 (Cavite) as Coordinator.

The whole month of July shall be devoted to activities not only to enhance the historic ties between these two nations (Phils. & U.S.A.) but also promote friendship among peoples of other countries or nationalities.
2. Method of Implementation
  - a. National Level — Convening of Special Communication of the Grand Lodge and invite as Guest Speakers, the American Ambassador to speak on Fil-American relations in the light of current contemporary events both in the USA and the Philippines, and with either the Secretary of Foreign Affairs of the Phils. or the Phil. Ambassador to the US, to give the response.
  - b. District Level — Each district should sponsor similar convocations and invite prominent nationals of other countries residing in their respective between the Philippines and the country that the guest speaker (s) represent, with a response

from the DDGM or local government official.

3. Planning and Funding — The planned activity for the NCR will be handled by the National Committee and will involve the Grand Lodge. Those on the District level shall be planned by each District. There should not be much expense involved except for programs to be printed and merienda (or dinner) to be served to the guests and audience.
4. Reporting and Monitoring System DDGM shall submit to the Grand Lodge thru the National Coordinator, a brief written report on the activity held during this month with appropriate photographs of the occasion and the perceived results of the activity. This report should be submitted not later than August 31, 1987.

Senior Masons, defined as Master Masons in good standing who: — are 60 years of age or over as of Oct. 1, 1987 OR

— Have attained at least 30 years of continuous service to the Craft (even if they are below 60 years of age)

THIS LIST SHALL BE SUBMITTED NOT LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 1987.

ii. The following special Diamond Jubilee Awards shall be given each Senior Citizen:

— To those qualified brethren who have attained more than 60 years as of Oct. 1, 1987 but have been Master Masons for less than 30 years — Certificates of recognition.

— To those qualified brethren who have been Master Masons continuously for 30 years but not less than 50 years — Grand Master's Lapel pin.

— To those who have been MMs continuously for at least 50 years — Genuine Lambskin Apron with his name, Lodge, and date of raising inscribed.

iii. These Awards shall be presented during the 75th Diamond Jubilee main celebration on December 19, 1987.

b. District Level — Each lodge shall dedicate their October stated meetings

to their senior members by having them participate in the meetings or conferral of degrees as presiding officer or occupying any other position (pro-tem) on these occasions. A Masonic Calendar being prepared by a committee chaired by VW Crispulo Fernandez shall be launched, both as a testimonial to our national heroes, and fund raising campaign for the Grand Lodge Temple.

b. District Level — Each district shall hold a special program to honor a specific hero, or heroes, during which the virtues and excellent of the hero should be extolled as an example worthy of emulation. It is suggested that this be open to the public, specially school children, that the memory of our heroes be kept alive in the minds of the younger generation of Filipinos who might not be aware of the greatness of these heroes.

3. Planning and Funding — The activity to be held at the NCR and participated in by Grand Lodge Officers shall be planned and funded by the National Sub-Committee. On the District level, each district shall be free to choose the type of activity to undertake and to if any, to be provided by each District.

4. Reporting and Monitoring System — Each DDGM shall submit a brief report of the activity that shall have been undertaken, accompanied by action shots (photographs) of the affair. This report shall be submitted to the Grand Lodge not later than December 31, 1987.

## PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES

1. Objective — To aid and assist 750 crippled children or ten (10) children for every year of

existence of the MW Grand Lodge.

## 2. Method of Implementation

National & District Levels — All lodges shall conduct a census within their respective jurisdictions of crippled children, obtaining the following data:

- a) Name, age, sex and address of child.
- b) Parents of child and current employment
- c) Medical history of child and attending physician, if any
- d) Assistance required and probable cost thereof.

THIS LIST SHOULD BE SUBMITTED NOT LATER THAN DEC. 31, 1987.

The type of assistance that can be considered in this program are the following:

- a) Orthopedic Surgery
- b) Underwriting cost of artificial limbs, braces, etc.
- c) Providing crutches or wheel-chairs
- d) Financial assistance to families of hospitalized crippled children.
- e) Christmas Party or cheers for the children

## 3. Planning and Funding — This program is actually a long-range program and may entail sub-

stantial expenses that may be beyond our present collective capacity to underwrite. Consequently, it may be necessary to coordinate our efforts with other appendant organizations, although it is realized that we may be imposing on the same brethren who are members of all these appendant bodies.

The point to remember is that before any Lodge or District should commit itself to providing specific aid and assistance, it should be first ascertained that the assistance to be rendered is within their capacity to give without serious injury to them or their members. Each district or each lodge is therefore given the discretion to decide the type of assistance that each can extend to a crippled child, bearing in mind the guidelines mentioned before.

## 4. Reporting and Monitoring System — In addition to the data required in par. 2, each DDGM shall submit a report of the nature of assistance so far rendered during the month of December, the name particulars of the beneficiary. This report should be submitted to the Grand Lodge not later than January 31, 1988.

We are pleased to announce that our request to the LTC for the issuance of Commemorative Car Plates as part of the 75th (Diamond Jubilee) Anniversary of the MW Grand Lodge of the Philippines has been approved. The contract for the production of the first 1,000 pairs has been signed and we expect delivery within the next two weeks. The production was initially funded by the Temple Builders Club.

For the information of the Brethren, this project is intended to raise funds for the implementation of the Grand Lodge Temple Building and we urge all to support this worthy endeavor.

The following are the materials details of this project:

1. *Size and Material.* The car plates are of the same size and material as the regular LTC vehicle plates. Identifying letters and numbers, only the latter being embossed, will be in blue color together with the Square and Compass emblem situated on the left side, as well as the words and numbers "Grand Lodge of the Philippines 1912-1987." The entire background is white. All paint materials are of first class (reflectorized) quality.

2. *Plate Numbers.* The first 863 pairs are numbered from 001 to 863. All these plate numbers will have "GLP" as the common identifying letters except that numbers which are also numbers of existing Lodges will have as their identifying letters for *Worshipful Master* and will be reserved for incumbent Masters and are considered as *special plates*, along with those specified below.

Other special plates are the following:

- a) 42 pairs "DDGM - 1A" to "DDGM - 040"
- b) 42 pairs "DGL" followed by the district number.
- c) Grand Master's and Past Grand Masters' car plates.
- d) Other Grand Officers (Other than PGMs).
- e) All triple numbers, such as 111, 222, 333, 444, 555, 666, 777, 888, 999 preceded by letters of the buyer's choice.

3. *Prices of Car Plates.* Ordinary (GLP) car plates are priced at P300.00 a pair, of which only P250.00 will be remitted to the Grand Lodge as payment while P50.00 will be retained by the Lodge and/or District that sold the car plates.

*Special Car plates* (i.e., "WMs", "DDGMs", "DGLs", etc.) will be priced at P500.00 net, except that triple numbers will be sold at a minimum of P1,000.00 net a pair.

After the ceremony, the brethren will proceed to MW Rudyardo V. Bunda's Rest House at Noveleta for fellowship.

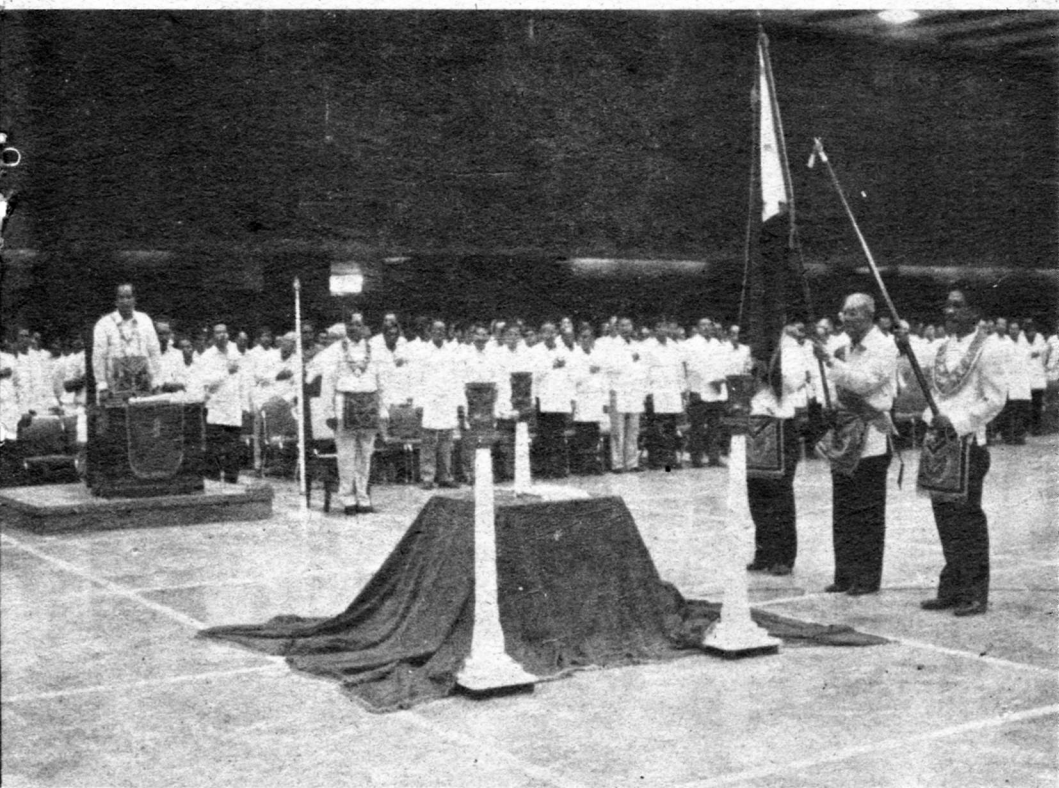

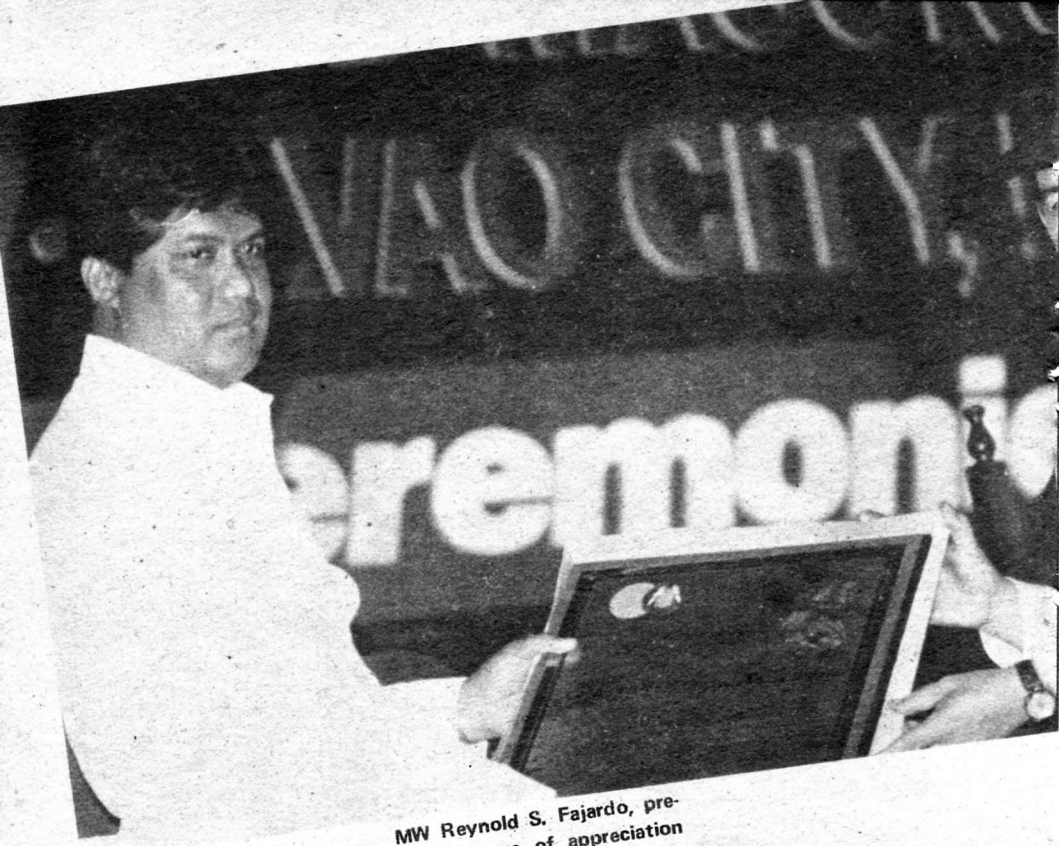

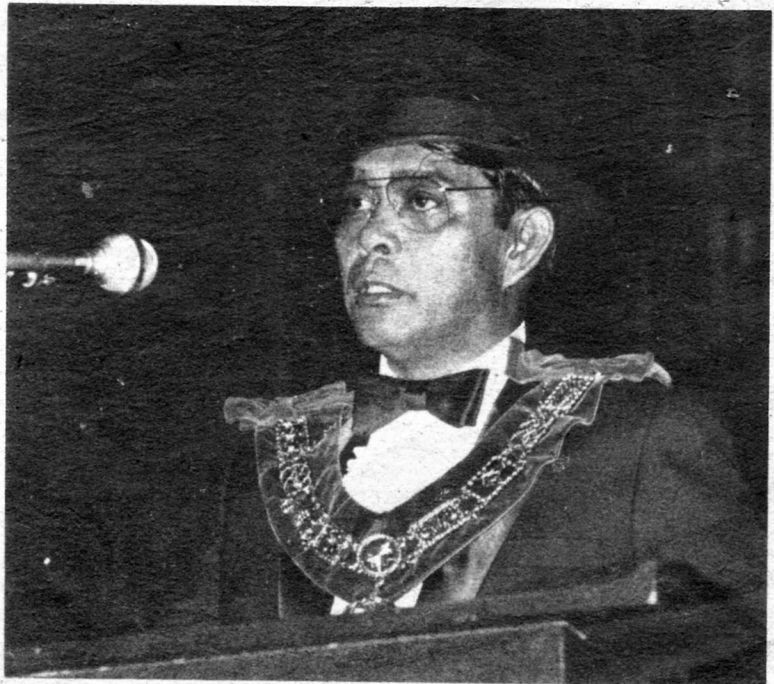

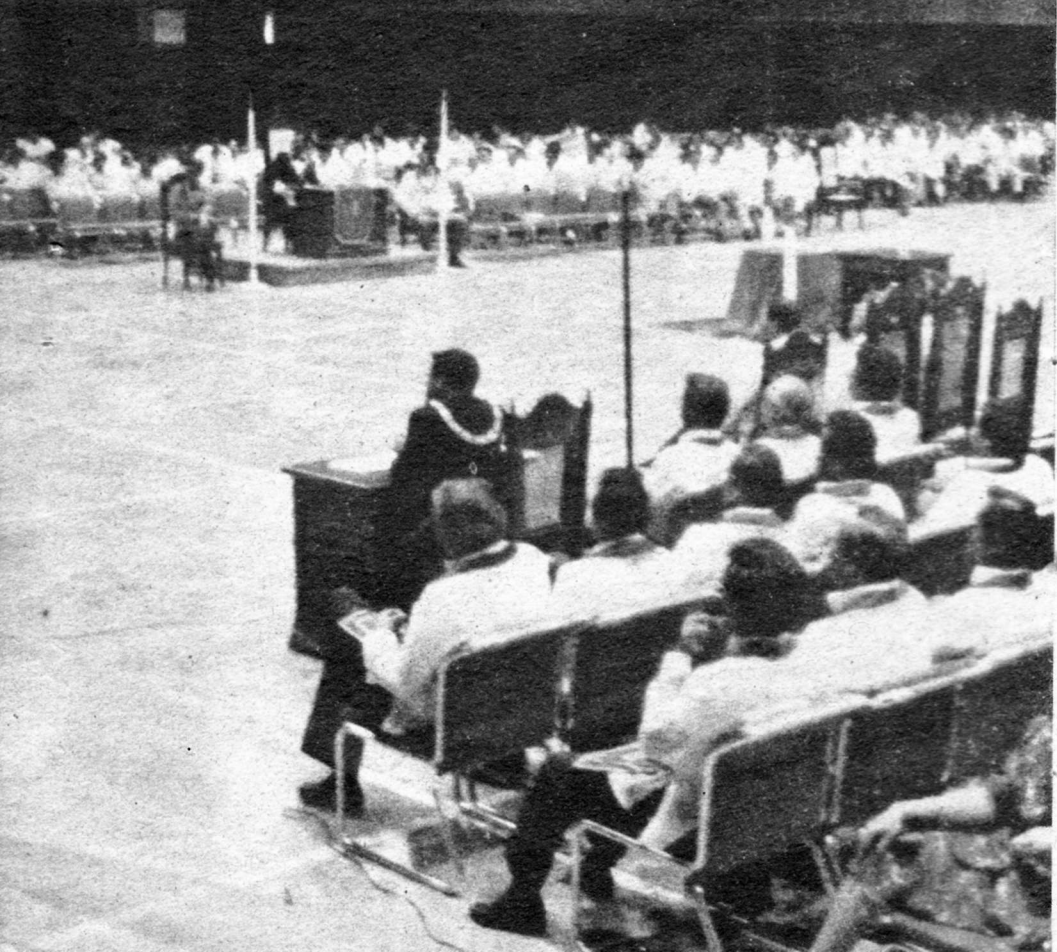
